SHORT HAIR STYLE CHALLENGES

ike every other type of hair, short hairstyles come with their own built in challenges. While short hairstyles can be a breeze to maintain on a daily basis, they can be more demanding on a monthly term.

Short hairstyles can look absolutely stunning right out of the salon, but hair always grows and once tresses extend to a certain point, a precision bob, shag, pixie, chop or crop will start to lose its finely crafted shape. Layers that are growing out in a short style can be especially troublesome if not managed properly.

Although layers in your short do might have looked absolutely fabulous while you were sitting in the salon chair, when you got home and started to work with your new style, you might have discovered that the layers were not to your liking in the harsh reality of your bathroom mirror. You might also have discovered that they were slightly uneven, hard to manage or you just didn't like the way that they looked.

Yes it's true that short hair layers, as they grow out, can also pose some additional issues. There are several options to harness out of control strands. These include:

Create Texture To Blend Shorter Strands Into Longer Ones

Regardless if you are growing out your

layers between hair cuts or growing them out to one length on a more permanent basis, create texture in your

tresses to instantly blend the layers into the rest of your style. Whether you use a round brush and blow-dry your tresses to add bend or use hot rollers, a curling iron or hook and latch style rollers, when you create curls or waves the layers will be more seamless.

2 Sweep Strands Off The Face For Seamless Blending

For 2007, styles that feature hair swept off the face are becoming more popular. To create a perfect blending of short layers with the rest of your longer strands, wrap hair around the round brush, hot or other rollers so that the tresses are directly off your face. You can also experiment with brushing your hair all to one side, tucking it behind your ears or directing it into a faux pageboy

and pinning it in place.

Headbands are sizzling hot, just take a peek at Jessica Simpson. Even better, they come in a dizzying array of styles from the hard U-shaped bands with or without teeth to the adjustable bandeau bands. The elasticized bandeau headbands are designed to slip over the head and hold hair snugly in place.

They can be worn right at the hairline or slightly back towards the crown. Utilize the bandeau style headbands to hold down any short layers near the front of your face line that are uneven, too short or out of control.

The du-rag (doo-rag) style of headbands might also work as effectively as a bandeau style. If you love the shape of your head and like your hair worn snug against your scalp, a du-rag might just do the trick. Experiment to find your own best solution.

If headbands don't fit with your personal style, experiment with jaws, claws, salon clips or even bobby pins. When Sarah Jessica Parker was growing out her short bangs on Sex And The City, she wore a cascade of tradi-

tional bobby pins, in a contrasting color from her hair hue.

Part Ways With Your Old Profile

Some hairdressers recommend altering the part to help blend and disguise uneven or awkward layers. Celebrity Hairdresser Ken Paves instantly alters layers by clipping in longer strands. For actress Marley Shelton and Ashlee Simpson, Ken equalized too-short bangs and layers by carefully hand-attaching a longer fringe that was swept across the front of the face

5Mini Ponytails & Twists

Cameron Diaz utilizes mini-ponytails and messy twists to pull her growing-out layers off of her face. Rather than notice that her short style needs a trim or that she suffers from uneven layers, most fans only see how adorable and edgy Cameron's style can be. Whether you decide to pin your growing out layers into a messy mini-pony or twist, experiment with ways to see bother signed districts.



elastics to create a functional "hide those layers" hairstyle that is unique and all your own.

6Styling Products To The Rescue

Wet look styles can work wonders for short hairstyles at that awkward in-

between stage. Experiment with styling gel, glaze, mousse, creams and setting sprays to hold rebellious layers in place. Shampoo hair and towel blot the excess moisture. Apply a strong holding gel or glaze to your still damp strands. Direct hair back from your face. Let tresses air-dry for a "wet look."

Tousling short strands can also help disguise a shapeless overgrown cut. Apply a good styling mousse to damp strands and use fingertips to scrunch and tousle.

7A Sexy New Color

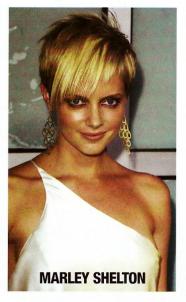
In some cases a short cut is designed specifically to work with multi-dimensional hues such as carefully layered highlights and lowlights. When hair color is not maintained in unison with maintenance trims and cuts, your layers and style might still



look out of sync. If you can't afford to have your hair color refreshed, experiment with color extending shampoos and leave-in conditioners that will help brighten faded hues.

Opt For Add-on Strands

One of the miracles of add-on ponytails, chignons and individual strands is that they can smooth over any of the rough edges from layers that are out of control to a short cut that has lost its shape.

I recently decided to follow the new trend for short hair and had my hairdresser cut a textured short crop for me. While I love my new cut, now I am worried that I will run out of ways to wear my new short hair without getting bored. Any ideas on how I can change up my new 'do?-Rachel, New York

Yes, short hair is definitely back in fashion for 2007. Led by shorter hairstyles highlighted on fashion runways and red carpets, consumers are adopting everything from variations of the original short "Rachel" bob style worn by Jennifer Aniston on Friends to sassy textured crops and chops that Halle Berry made famous a few years ago.

Even actresses like Veronica Mars star Kristen Bell, who is currently growing out her tresses, are adopting "faux" short hair looks by combining short fringes with cute chignons softly pulled behind their ears to give the illusion of short hair. Kristen recently demonstrated how to have a faux short hair style while actually wearing longer tresses.

The good news: The textured croppy chop can be worn a variety of ways. Whether you decide to change up your hairstyle with styling products, your fingers or hot styling tools, you do have lots of different options:

- 1. Messy tousled style
- 2. Edgy, sassy and sexy
- 3. Finger waved
- 4. Dressed up with an add-on chignon
- 5. Instantly longer with clip-on hair
- 6. With an add-on ponytail or braid
- 7. Dressed up with a variety of short hair friendly hair accessories
- 8. Altered texture (straight to wavy and curly or reversed)

Creating a new look for your crop requires some initial planning and the willingness to experiment with a variety of looks. Whether you decide to go with a messy tousled style or one that is finger waved, you must have the proper styling products, hot tools like irons or curlers and lots of creativity on your part.

Even better, as your hair starts to grow out, you will have even more options to play with. Keep in mind that a short hairstyle can also be instantly transformed with highlights, lowlights, a new fringe, part or even cute headwear like berets and newsboy caps.

I have a medium curl to my short bobbed hair. Normally I straighten it but I'm looking for ways to speed up my daily hairstyling time. I would love to let my hair air dry right out of the shower but I'm worried my hair would turn into a big ball of frizzy curls.-June. Boston

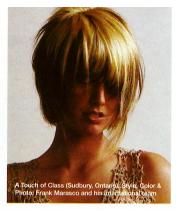
There are several tips you can try to let your curly hair "air dry" without turning into a guaranteed "frizz head."

These tips include the following:

- 1. Start with a moisturizing shampoo that will impart softness to your natural curls.
- 2. Use a good rinse-out conditioner. With natural curls, moisture is lost naturally due to the shape of the hair's cuticle. The more moisture you add the softer the curls.
- 3. Finish with a cool or cold water rinse to seal the newly added moisture into your cuticles.
- 4. Use an absorbent towel to absorb excess water.
- 5. Mix a cocktail of defrisant balm like Phytodefrisant and a straightening gel like celebrity hairdresser Robert Hallowell's Flat Factor in the palms of your hands. Make sure your fingers are coated with the hairstyling cocktail.
- 6. Rake your fingers (use them like a comb) through your hair making sure the entire head is lightly covered with the mixture.
- 7. Once the product has been completely distributed throughout your strands, use your fingers to lift individual curls and gently tug on the ends of the curls to slightly straighten.
- 8. Work your way around your head as your hair dries, gently pulling curly strands down to discourage them from puffing up. The combination of the defrisant balm and the straightening gel will prevent the formation of frizz and will gently soften your curls.

Your hair may still develop curls as it dries naturally but will most likely dry into a softer, straighter formation due to the styling cocktail. To block against frizz, finish with a shine serum to seal in moisture and block out frizz causing humidity.

Although this process works well for most people with a slight to medium curl, people with super curly strands might not achieve the same results. When in doubt, try out new tricks on the weekends when you can experiment and not worry so much about the results.



I recently lost a lot of weight. My hairdresser told me that the shape of my face has changed from round to oval. She encouraged me to get a new, shorter style with lots of layers which she said would play off my new cheekbones. I have two questions-can face shapes seriously change and how would layers bring out my cheekbones?-Julie, Cincinnati

Congratulations on the success of your diet. Yes, face shapes can and do change. They can change for a number of reasons from losing and gaining weight, age, hormone fluctuations and even depending on the hairstyle that you are wearing. It is not uncommon for people who lose a large amount of weight to discover that your round face shape was really an oval with lots of extra padding.

I can't of course speak to all of the reasons that your stylist is encouraging you to go short with more layers but if you trust her work, then it's probably a great suggestion. If you're nervous about a brand new look, ask her to show you some photo examples that you can temporarily borrow. Take the image samples home with you and show them to friends and family to get their input on how you might look with the suggested style or styles.

Layers historically can offer so many different benefits depending on how they are created. Your stylist is probably planning on creating layers that nestle around your face acting as an instant accent for your new cheekbones and to help your eyes "pop." Carefully crafted layers can soften facial angles, add instant movement as well as enhance volume or natural texture.

Although it is very important that you feel good about any hair change and make it for all the right reasons, it can be a great mood lifter to get a sizzling new cut or hairstyle after achieving a major body reshaping. If your concern is with going shorter, start slowly and ask your stylist to take you gradually shorter in a series of visits rather than all at once. Going shorter over a period of months can definitely give you a chance to decide if you like the abbreviated lengths, allow you to hold at a particular length or even go shorter.
